



# The Agenda for Liberia's Transformation (ALT)

## Constitution and Bylaws

A Cross-Partisan Ideological Political Movement dedicated to advancing structural and political reforms in Liberia through evidence-based policy, strategic electoral engagement, and the mobilization of diaspora resources for national transformation. This Constitution establishes the foundational law, organizational structure, operating principles, and governance framework of the Agenda for Liberia's Transformation.

# Preamble

We, the founding members and adherents of the Agenda for Liberia's Transformation, cognizant of the enduring challenges confronting the Republic of Liberia — including entrenched institutional weakness, governance deficits, economic underdevelopment, and the exclusion of reform-minded leadership from national decision-making — do hereby ordain and establish this Constitution as the supreme governing law of our Movement.

We affirm our unwavering commitment to the sovereignty, dignity, and democratic aspirations of the Liberian people. We recognize that genuine national transformation demands more than electoral cycles; it requires the deliberate reconstruction of Liberia's political, economic, and social institutions upon foundations of accountability, transparency, evidence, and justice. We declare that the path to lasting progress lies in principled cross-partisan collaboration — uniting citizens of diverse ideological persuasions around a shared national vision rather than narrow partisan interests.

We further affirm the indispensable role of the Liberian diaspora as partners in the transformation process — contributors of capital, expertise, advocacy, and international networks that can accelerate structural change within the Republic. We commit to building bridges between citizens at home and abroad in pursuit of a singular, unified transformational agenda.

In pursuit of this vision, acknowledging the lessons of Liberia's history and the demands of its future, and invoking the heritage of all those who have sacrificed for a better Liberia, we hereby establish the Agenda for Liberia's Transformation as a movement grounded in principle, driven by evidence, and accountable to the Liberian people.

## **Our Conviction**

Structural reform, not partisan politics, is the engine of genuine national transformation.

## **Our Method**

Evidence-based policy recommendations grounded in research, data, and best practices.

## **Our Alliance**

Cross-partisan unity between home-based citizens and the global Liberian diaspora.

# Article I — Name, Identity, and Legal Status

## Section 1.1 — Official Name

The organization shall be officially known as the **Agenda for Liberia's Transformation**, hereinafter referred to as "ALT" or "the Movement." The Movement may, for communications and branding purposes, also use the stylized designation **ALT-Liberia** in international and diaspora contexts.

## Section 1.2 — Nature and Character

ALT is a cross-partisan ideological political movement, not a political party. It does not field candidates under its own banner in elections. Instead, it identifies, evaluates, endorses, and supports reform-oriented candidates across existing political parties and as independents, based strictly on programmatic alignment with the ALT reform agenda and demonstrated personal integrity.

## Section 1.3 — Legal Domicile

The principal office and legal domicile of ALT shall be in Monrovia, Montserrado County, Republic of Liberia. ALT shall register and operate in accordance with the laws of the Republic of Liberia as applicable to civil society organizations and political advocacy bodies. ALT may also establish a diaspora coordination headquarters in the United States of America and affiliate chapters in any country with a significant Liberian diaspora population.

## Section 1.4 — Duration

ALT is established in perpetuity and shall continue to exist until formally dissolved in accordance with the procedures specified under Article XII of this Constitution. The Movement's work shall persist across electoral cycles, political administrations, and generational transitions, constituting an enduring institutional force for reform in Liberia.

# Article II — Vision, Mission, and Core Objectives

## Section 2.1 — Vision Statement

ALT envisions a **transformed Republic of Liberia** — a nation governed by accountable, transparent, and effective institutions; driven by evidence-based public policy; led by principled and competent national leadership; and characterized by broadly shared economic prosperity and social justice for all Liberians, at home and in the diaspora.

## Section 2.2 — Mission Statement

The Mission of ALT is to advance structural and political reforms in Liberia by producing and disseminating evidence-based policy recommendations, identifying and supporting reform-oriented candidates for national leadership — with particular emphasis on the National Legislature — and mobilizing financial, material, and human resources from the Liberian diaspora and domestic civil society in service of transformation-focused candidates and initiatives.

## Section 2.3 — Core Strategic Objectives

### Policy Research and Advocacy

Produce rigorous, nonpartisan, evidence-based policy analyses, legislative proposals, and reform blueprints addressing Liberia's most pressing structural challenges, including governance, rule of law, economic development, public finance management, anti-corruption, and social sector reform.

### Candidate Identification and Electoral Support

Systematically identify, vet, endorse, and actively support candidates for national and legislative office who demonstrate genuine commitment to the ALT reform agenda, including through campaign strategy assistance, public endorsements, voter mobilization, and financial support within legally permissible limits.

### Diaspora Engagement and Resource Mobilization

Build structured, sustained partnerships with the global Liberian diaspora community to mobilize financial contributions, technical expertise, advocacy capacity, and international networks in direct support of the transformational agenda and endorsed candidates.

### Public Awareness and Civic Education

Educate and inform the Liberian electorate about reform priorities, the quality of governance, legislative performance, and the democratic tools available to citizens for demanding accountability from their elected representatives.

### Coalition Building and Cross-Partisan Collaboration

Foster principled alliances with civil society organizations, professional associations, faith communities, traditional leaders, and reform-aligned political actors across the ideological spectrum in pursuit of shared transformational goals.

# Article III — Guiding Principles and Values

The Agenda for Liberia's Transformation shall at all times be guided by the following foundational principles, which shall govern every aspect of the Movement's internal governance, external engagement, and strategic operations. These principles are non-derogable and shall not be subordinated to political expediency, institutional convenience, or personal interests of any member or leader.



## National Interest Supremacy

The long-term national interest of the Liberian people shall always take precedence over partisan, ethnic, regional, religious, or personal considerations in all ALT decisions and activities.



## Transparency and Accountability

ALT shall operate with the highest standards of financial transparency, operational openness, and institutional accountability to its members and the Liberian public, practicing what it preaches in national governance.



## Diaspora Integration

The Liberian diaspora shall be treated as an equal and essential constituency of the Movement, with formal representation in ALT's governance structures and a recognized role in resource mobilization and strategic planning.



## Evidence-Based Decision Making

All policy recommendations, candidate evaluations, and strategic decisions shall be grounded in rigorous empirical research, credible data, comparative analysis, and documented best practices.



## Cross-Partisan Inclusivity

ALT shall welcome members, supporters, and allies regardless of their political party affiliation, provided they are aligned with the reform agenda. No single party or ideological faction shall dominate or capture the Movement.



## Personal and Institutional Integrity

ALT leaders and members shall maintain impeccable personal conduct, avoiding corruption, abuse of position, misrepresentation, and any behavior that would bring disrepute to the Movement or undermine public trust in its mission.

# Article IV — Membership

## Section 4.1 — Categories of Membership

ALT shall maintain four distinct categories of membership, each with defined rights, responsibilities, and modes of engagement. These categories recognize the diverse ways in which individuals and institutions may contribute to the transformational agenda.

### Founding Members

Individuals who formally participate in the establishment of ALT and adopt this Constitution at the founding assembly. Founding Members shall have permanent voting rights and shall constitute the initial Electoral College for inaugural leadership elections.

### Full Members

Individuals who apply for and are admitted to membership after the founding, complete the orientation program, pay applicable dues, and formally subscribe to the ALT Charter of Commitment. Full Members enjoy all voting rights and are eligible for elected office within ALT.

### Diaspora Members

Liberians residing outside the Republic of Liberia who join ALT and participate through diaspora chapters. Diaspora Members pay dues, subscribe to the Charter of Commitment, and have full voting rights within their chapter and proportional representation in the National Council.

### Associate Members

Non-Liberian individuals and institutional partners who support ALT's mission and contribute expertise, resources, or advocacy capacity. Associate Members do not have voting rights but may participate in policy forums, advisory committees, and technical working groups.

## Section 4.2 — Membership Eligibility

Any person of Liberian nationality who is at least eighteen (18) years of age, who subscribes to the principles of this Constitution, and who commits to the ALT Charter of Commitment shall be eligible for Full or Diaspora Membership. No person shall be denied membership on account of political party affiliation, religion, ethnicity, gender, region of origin, or socioeconomic status. Persons convicted of corruption, financial crimes, or serious human rights violations shall be ineligible for membership.

## Section 4.3 — Member Rights and Obligations

### Member Rights

- Receive all official ALT communications and publications
- Vote in general membership elections and referenda
- Stand for elected positions within ALT (Full Members)
- Participate in policy forums and working groups
- Access movement resources and training programs
- Appeal decisions affecting their membership status

### Member Obligations

- Uphold and promote the principles of this Constitution
- Pay dues as prescribed by the National Council
- Participate actively in ALT programs and activities
- Maintain conduct consistent with the ALT Code of Ethics
- Disclose conflicts of interest promptly and fully
- Refrain from actions that bring disrepute to ALT

## Section 4.4 — Termination of Membership

Membership may be voluntarily resigned at any time by written notice to the Secretariat. Involuntary termination of membership requires a formal disciplinary proceeding in accordance with Article IX of this Constitution. Grounds for involuntary termination include serious violation of the Code of Ethics, conviction for a criminal offense involving moral turpitude, or sustained conduct inconsistent with ALT's stated principles. No member shall be expelled without due process, including the right to be heard and to appeal.

# Article V — Organizational Structure and Governance

ALT shall be governed through a multi-tiered institutional structure designed to ensure democratic participation, strategic coherence, operational efficiency, and clear lines of accountability. The following bodies constitute the official governance architecture of the Movement.

## National Assembly

Supreme deliberative and policy-making body

## Executive Secretariat

Operational management and administration



## National Council

Strategic oversight and implementation guidance

## Chapter Councils

Local representation and grassroots execution

This governance architecture ensures that ultimate authority rests with the membership at large through the National General Assembly, while day-to-day operations are managed by professional leadership accountable to elected bodies at each tier of the organization.

### Section 5.1 — The National General Assembly (NGA)

The National General Assembly is the supreme governing body of ALT. It shall consist of all Full Members, Founding Members, and duly elected Diaspora Member representatives. The NGA shall convene in ordinary session every two (2) years and in extraordinary session whenever convened by the National Council or upon petition of at least thirty percent (30%) of Full Members. Quorum shall be fifty percent (50%) plus one of registered delegates. The NGA shall have the power to adopt and amend this Constitution, elect national leadership, approve the strategic plan, review and ratify major financial decisions, and dissolve the Movement.

### Section 5.2 — The National Council (NC)

The National Council shall serve as ALT's governing board between NGA sessions. It shall consist of fifteen (15) members: five (5) elected from the home-based membership at large, five (5) elected from Diaspora Chapters, three (3) representatives of the Women's Caucus, and two (2) representatives of the Youth Caucus. The National Council shall meet at least quarterly, in person or virtually. It shall exercise all governing powers of the NGA between NGA sessions, subject to the limitations of this Constitution. The National Council shall approve the annual budget, oversee the Executive Secretariat, and make endorsement decisions on candidates for national office.

### Section 5.3 — The Executive Secretariat

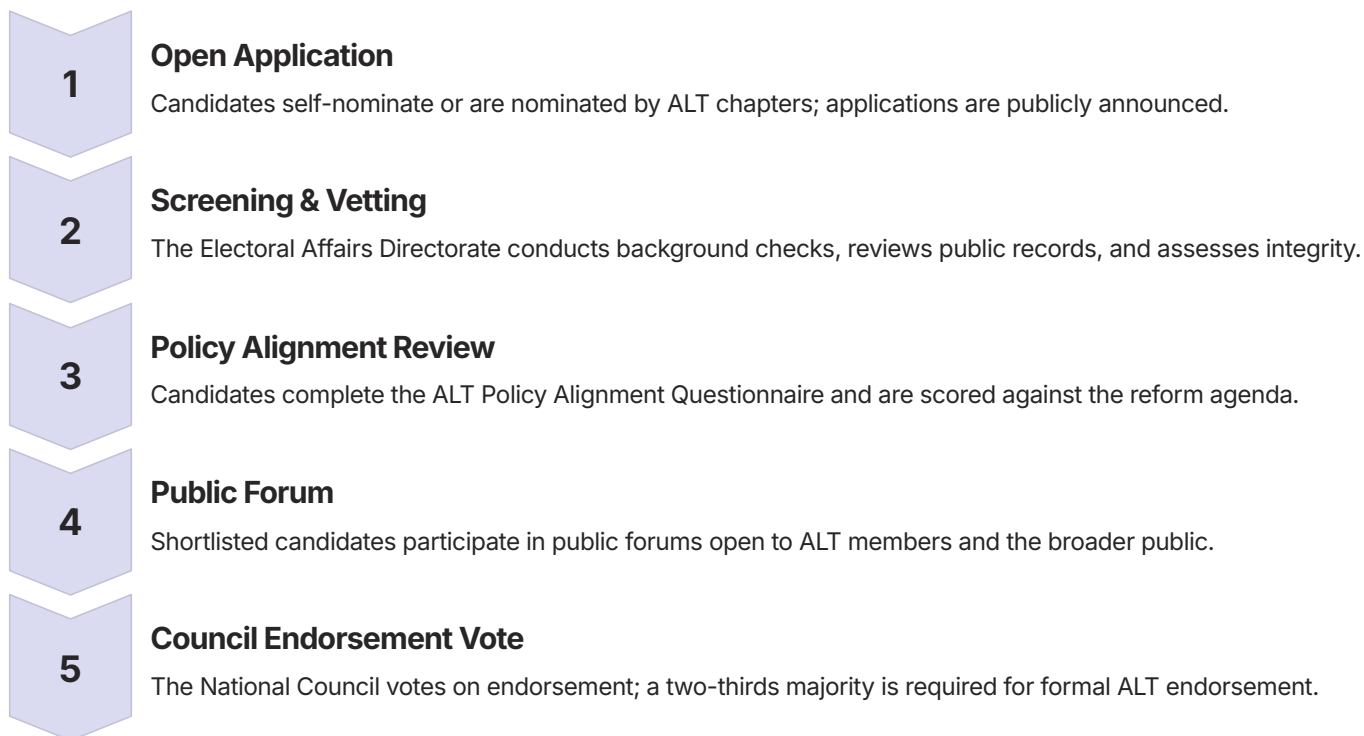
The Executive Secretariat is the operational leadership body of ALT. It shall be headed by the Secretary-General, who shall be elected by the National General Assembly for a term of four (4) years, renewable once. The Secretary-General shall be supported by a Deputy Secretary-General, a Director of Policy and Research, a Director of Electoral Affairs, a Director of Diaspora Engagement and Resource Mobilization, a Director of Finance and Administration, and a Director of Communications. The Secretariat shall implement NGA and National Council decisions, manage day-to-day operations, coordinate chapter activities, and represent ALT in external engagements.

### Section 5.4 — The Advisory Board

ALT shall maintain an Advisory Board composed of distinguished Liberians and international allies who provide strategic guidance, technical expertise, and reputational support to the Movement. Advisory Board members shall be appointed by the National Council based on demonstrated excellence in public service, academia, civil society, business, or international affairs. Advisory Board members shall serve in an honorary, nonvoting capacity.

# Article VI — Candidate Evaluation and Electoral Endorsement

The identification and support of reform-oriented candidates for national leadership — especially for the National Legislature — is among ALT's most consequential functions. ALT shall establish and maintain a rigorous, transparent, and nonpartisan candidate evaluation framework to ensure that every endorsement reflects genuine alignment with the transformational agenda.



## Section 6.1 — Endorsement Criteria


To qualify for ALT endorsement, a candidate must satisfy all of the following criteria: (a) demonstrated commitment to at least seventy percent (70%) of ALT's published reform priorities; (b) a verifiable record of integrity and absence of credible corruption allegations; (c) educational and professional qualifications commensurate with the office sought; (d) a genuine willingness to engage with and account to ALT's membership throughout the electoral cycle; and (e) acceptance of ALT's post-election accountability framework, including regular legislative performance reporting for legislative candidates.

## Section 6.2 — Nature and Scope of Support

ALT's support for endorsed candidates may include public endorsements and media advocacy, inclusion in ALT communications and outreach materials, access to ALT's policy research and briefing resources, campaign training and strategic advisory support, and financial contributions mobilized through the ALT Transformation Fund, subject to applicable Liberian electoral laws. ALT support shall never be conditioned on a candidate's party affiliation, religious identity, or personal loyalty to any ALT leader. ALT may withdraw an endorsement at any time if a candidate materially departs from the commitments made during the vetting process.

## Section 6.3 — Post-Election Accountability

ALT shall publish an annual Legislative Performance Scorecard for all endorsed candidates who are elected to the National Legislature, evaluating their performance against stated reform commitments. This Scorecard shall be publicly disseminated through all ALT communication channels and presented to the relevant constituencies. Endorsed candidates who consistently underperform against their commitments may have their ALT endorsement formally rescinded for the subsequent election cycle.

 ALT endorsements are based exclusively on reform alignment and integrity — never on party affiliation, religious identity, ethnicity, or personal relationships with ALT leadership.

# Article VII — Diaspora Engagement and Resource Mobilization

## Section 7.1 — The Diaspora as a Strategic Constituency

ALT formally recognizes the Liberian diaspora — comprising Liberian nationals and persons of Liberian descent residing outside the Republic of Liberia — as an indispensable strategic constituency of the Movement. The diaspora shall not be treated as a mere fundraising base, but as an equal partner in agenda-setting, policy development, and movement governance. ALT shall establish a structured Diaspora Engagement Program to ensure sustained, meaningful participation by diaspora members in every aspect of the Movement's work.

## Section 7.2 — Diaspora Chapter Structure

ALT shall organize diaspora members through geographically constituted Diaspora Chapters, established in any country or metropolitan area with a minimum of twenty-five (25) registered ALT Diaspora Members. Recognized Diaspora Chapters shall be established in: the United States of America (with sub-chapters in major cities including Washington D.C., New York, Atlanta, Minneapolis, and Providence), the United Kingdom, Germany, the Netherlands, Ghana, Côte d'Ivoire, and Sierra Leone, and any other jurisdiction where sufficient membership exists. Each Diaspora Chapter shall elect its own Chapter Executive Committee and shall send proportional delegates to the National General Assembly.

## Section 7.3 — The ALT Transformation Fund



### Member Dues

Tiered annual membership dues structure accommodating home-based and diaspora members at graduated contribution levels.



### Diaspora Fundraising

Annual fundraising galas, virtual fundraising campaigns, and direct solicitation of major diaspora donors aligned with the reform agenda.



### Grants and Partnerships

Applications for grants from international democracy-support organizations, foundations, and bilateral development partners aligned with ALT's nonpartisan reform mission.



### Domestic Contributions

Solicitation of financial and material support from Liberian businesses, professionals, and civil society actors who support the transformational agenda.

## Section 7.4 — Financial Governance of the Transformation Fund

The ALT Transformation Fund shall be managed by the Director of Finance and Administration under the oversight of the National Council's Finance and Audit Committee. All fund expenditures above five thousand United States Dollars (USD 5,000) shall require dual authorization from the Secretary-General and the Finance Committee Chair. An independent external audit shall be conducted annually by a certified public accounting firm, and the audit report shall be published in full on ALT's official website and distributed to all members. No disbursement from the Transformation Fund for candidate support shall be made without a formal endorsement resolution from the National Council. ALT shall at all times comply with all applicable Liberian laws governing financial contributions to political activities.

# Article VIII — Policy Research and the ALT Reform Agenda

The intellectual and policy dimensions of ALT's work are its most distinctive contribution to Liberia's national discourse. ALT shall invest substantially in producing rigorous, original, evidence-based policy research that generates practical reform proposals for adoption by national leaders, the National Legislature, and the executive branch of government.

## The ALT Policy Institute

ALT shall establish and maintain a Policy Institute — a dedicated internal research and advocacy unit — staffed by qualified policy analysts, economists, legal scholars, and sector specialists. The Institute shall serve as the intellectual engine of the Movement.

The Institute shall produce: annual State of Reform Reports, legislative tracking analyses, sector-specific policy briefs, candidate briefing books, and comparative studies of governance reforms from peer countries.

## Priority Reform Areas

- **Governance and Rule of Law:** Constitutional reform, judicial independence, anti-corruption institutions
- **Legislature Reform:** Legislative capacity, constituency accountability, transparency
- **Public Finance:** Budget transparency, revenue mobilization, expenditure efficiency
- **Economic Development:** Investment climate, local content, agricultural transformation
- **Education and Health:** Quality, access, financing, and institutional reform
- **Electoral Reform:** NEC independence, voter registration, campaign finance regulation
- **Decentralization:** County governance, local democracy, resource allocation

## Section 8.2 — Research Standards and Independence

All ALT policy research shall adhere to the highest standards of intellectual rigor, methodological transparency, and political independence. Research conclusions shall follow the evidence, even when they challenge positions held by ALT-endorsed candidates or politically inconvenient narratives. The Director of Policy and Research shall be appointed on the basis of demonstrated academic and professional qualifications and shall be shielded from political interference in research processes by explicit constitutional protection. Any member or leader who attempts to suppress, alter, or selectively cite ALT research for political purposes shall be subject to disciplinary proceedings under Article IX.

## Section 8.3 — Dissemination and Public Engagement

ALT shall ensure that its policy work reaches the widest possible audience — including policymakers, legislators, civil society actors, journalists, international partners, and ordinary Liberian citizens. The Movement shall publish all research in accessible formats, including simplified policy briefs in plain language, radio broadcasts, community forums, social media content, and engagements with the National Legislature's committee system. ALT shall also convene an Annual National Reform Summit to publicly present its research findings and recommendations and to foster national dialogue on the transformation agenda.

# Article IX — Ethics, Discipline, and Accountability

The credibility of the Agenda for Liberia's Transformation rests, above all else, on the integrity of its members and leaders. ALT shall maintain a robust ethics and accountability framework to ensure that the Movement embodies the standards of conduct it demands of Liberia's national leadership.

## Section 9.1 — The ALT Code of Ethics

### Prohibition on Self-Dealing

No ALT leader or member shall use their position within the Movement to secure personal financial gain, preferential treatment in endorsement decisions, or any other private benefit at the expense of the Movement's integrity or resources.

### Conflict of Interest Disclosure

All leaders and members must promptly disclose any actual or potential conflict of interest arising from their professional affiliations, personal relationships, or financial interests. Leaders with conflicts shall recuse themselves from relevant decisions.

### Prohibition on Hate Speech and Divisive Rhetoric

No ALT member or leader shall engage in ethnic, religious, regional, or gender-based hate speech or divisive political rhetoric, whether in ALT fora or in their public capacity. Violations shall be treated as serious disciplinary matters.

### Financial Integrity

All persons handling ALT financial resources shall do so in strict conformity with approved budgets, procurement procedures, and financial regulations. Any misappropriation, regardless of amount, shall constitute grounds for immediate suspension and criminal referral.

## Section 9.2 — The Ethics and Disciplinary Committee

ALT shall maintain a standing Ethics and Disciplinary Committee (EDC) composed of five (5) members elected by the National General Assembly for staggered three-year terms. Members of the EDC must not simultaneously hold any other elected or appointed position within ALT. The EDC shall receive and investigate complaints against members and leaders, conduct fair and timely disciplinary proceedings, and impose sanctions proportionate to the gravity of established violations. The EDC shall operate with full independence from the Secretariat and the National Council. Its decisions may be appealed to the National General Assembly within thirty (30) days of issuance.

## Section 9.3 — Sanctions

The EDC may impose the following sanctions, in ascending order of severity: formal written reprimand, suspension of membership rights for a defined period, removal from any elected or appointed position within ALT, and permanent expulsion from membership. Sanctions involving removal from leadership positions or expulsion require a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the full EDC. Criminal conduct shall be referred to appropriate law enforcement authorities in addition to any internal sanctions imposed.

⚠ Any attempt by any leader or body within ALT to interfere with, intimidate, or improperly influence the Ethics and Disciplinary Committee shall itself constitute a serious violation of this Constitution and grounds for immediate disciplinary proceedings.

# Article X — Meetings, Voting, and Decision-Making

## Section 10.1 — National General Assembly Sessions

The NGA shall convene in Ordinary Session every two (2) years, at a date, time, and location determined by the National Council and communicated to all members no later than ninety (90) days in advance. The NGA shall convene in Extraordinary Session upon a resolution of the National Council or upon written petition signed by at least thirty percent (30%) of all registered Full and Diaspora Members. Extraordinary Sessions may be convened with no fewer than thirty (30) days' notice. All members in good standing shall have the right to attend, speak, and vote at NGA sessions, whether in person or through approved virtual participation platforms.

## Section 10.2 — National Council Meetings

The National Council shall meet at least once per quarter. The Secretary-General shall serve as ex officio Secretary to the Council but shall not vote in Council deliberations. A majority of Council members shall constitute a quorum. Council decisions shall be made by simple majority vote except as otherwise specified in this Constitution. Council meetings may be conducted in person, virtually, or in hybrid format. All Council meeting minutes shall be circulated to members within fifteen (15) days of each meeting.

## Section 10.3 — Voting Procedures and Thresholds

## Section 10.4 — Electronic Voting

ALT shall develop and maintain a secure electronic voting platform to enable diaspora members and home-based members who are unable to attend in-person sessions to participate in elections and referenda. The platform shall ensure voter authentication, ballot secrecy, and verifiable results. The National Council shall adopt detailed Electronic Voting Regulations, approved by the NGA, to govern the operation of this system. All electronic votes shall carry equal weight to in-person votes in all proceedings.

# Article XI — Finance, Audit, and Financial Governance

## Section 11.1 — Annual Budget

The Secretariat shall prepare a comprehensive annual budget no later than October 31st of each year for the succeeding fiscal year. The budget shall be submitted to the Finance and Audit Committee for review by November 15th and presented to the National Council for approval by December 15th. The approved budget shall be published in summary form on ALT's official website and communicated to all members. No expenditure shall be made outside the approved budget without prior authorization from the National Council, except for emergency operational expenditures not exceeding one thousand United States Dollars (USD 1,000), which may be approved by the Secretary-General and reported to the Finance Committee within five (5) working days.

## Section 11.2 — Sources of Revenue

### Membership Dues

Annual dues shall be established by the National Council in the membership regulations. Dues schedules shall be tiered by membership category and geographic location, with appropriate accommodations for home-based Liberian members of limited means.

### Diaspora Contributions and Fundraising

Contributions from Diaspora Chapters, major donors, and fundraising events shall be channeled through the Transformation Fund and managed in accordance with the Financial Governance Regulations adopted by the National Council.

### Institutional Grants

ALT may receive grants from qualified international foundations, democracy-support institutions, and bilateral development agencies, provided no grant creates a conflict of interest, compromises ALT's independence, or is received from any entity with partisan interests in Liberian politics.

### Domestic Fundraising

ALT may conduct fundraising within Liberia among individuals and organizations committed to the reform agenda, subject to full disclosure of donor identity and applicable legal requirements.

## Section 11.3 — Audit and Financial Transparency

ALT shall engage an independent, certified external auditor to conduct an annual audit of all financial accounts and the Transformation Fund. The auditor shall be appointed by the National Council upon recommendation of the Finance and Audit Committee and shall not be the same firm for more than three (3) consecutive years. The complete audit report, including any management letter, shall be published on ALT's official website within sixty (60) days of the close of each fiscal year and distributed to all members. Any material findings of financial irregularity shall be immediately referred to the Ethics and Disciplinary Committee and, where appropriate, to relevant legal authorities.

# Article XII — Amendments, Dissolution, and Transitional Provisions

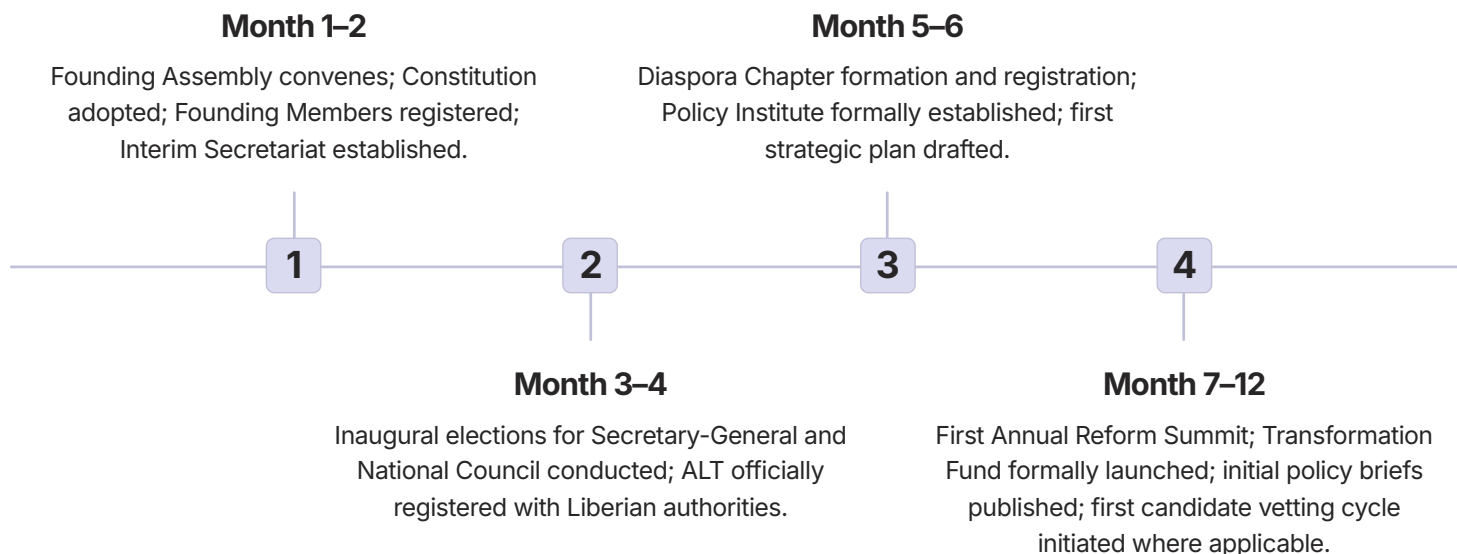
## Section 12.1 — Constitutional Amendments

This Constitution may be amended only by the National General Assembly. Proposed amendments must be submitted in writing to the Secretariat at least sixty (60) days before the relevant NGA session. The Secretariat shall circulate all proposed amendments to all members at least forty-five (45) days before the session. Amendments require the affirmative vote of at least three-quarters (3/4) of all delegates present and voting at a duly constituted NGA session. No amendment shall abrogate the fundamental principles set forth in Article III of this Constitution, the rights of members under Article IV, or the independence of the Ethics and Disciplinary Committee under Article IX. A proposed amendment to any of these protected provisions shall require unanimous consent of all registered delegates.

## Section 12.2 — Dissolution of the Movement

ALT may be dissolved only by a resolution of the National General Assembly adopted by at least three-quarters (3/4) of all registered delegates, provided that the proposed dissolution has been placed on the NGA agenda at least ninety (90) days in advance and that all members have been formally notified. In the event of dissolution, all assets of the Movement, after satisfaction of all lawful obligations and liabilities, shall be transferred to one or more qualified nonprofit organizations operating in the Republic of Liberia with missions aligned with democratic governance, civic education, or anti-corruption reform, as determined by the final National General Assembly. No assets shall be distributed to members, officers, or employees of ALT upon dissolution.

## Section 12.4 — Supremacy and Interpretation

This Constitution shall be the supreme law of the Agenda for Liberia's Transformation. All bylaws, regulations, resolutions, and directives adopted by any ALT body shall be subordinate to and consistent with this Constitution. In the event of any conflict between this Constitution and any other ALT instrument, this Constitution shall prevail. Questions of constitutional interpretation shall be referred to the Ethics and Disciplinary Committee, whose interpretation shall be final, subject to appeal to the National General Assembly.

- ✔ This Constitution was adopted by the founding members of the Agenda for Liberia's Transformation at the Founding Assembly. It shall enter into force immediately upon adoption and shall remain in full force until amended or the Movement is dissolved in accordance with Article XII.
